To whom it may concern,

The New York State Catholic Conference represents the Bishops of New York State in matters of public policy. The role of the Conference is to seek justice, fairness and charity for all, with a particular emphasis on the poor and vulnerable. Each year, the Conference issues a legislative agenda outlining specific objectives in the public policy arena. This agenda is based on a consistent set of social justice principles drawn from Gospel values and Catholic Social teaching, and transcends political platforms or ideologies.

In March of each year, the Conference sponsors a public policy forum called “Catholics at the Capitol,” in which Catholics from across New York State gather in Albany to advocate for some of these agenda issues. This year the event will be held on Tuesday, March 13, at the Empire State Plaza Convention Center. Many young people throughout the state want to participate in this day of advocacy, to learn more about the issues and our government, and possibly to speak to members of the legislature.
